Community Base is an independent charity providing a home for community and voluntary groups in Brighton and Hove and services to the local community.

In our accessible seven-floor building a few minutes from Brighton station, we provide low-cost office space, meeting rooms for hire, and a postal address service to community groups and charities.

We also provide a range of free services including:

- In-person signposting at our reception 5 days a week
- Online searches for local services, jobs and volunteering opportunities

The friendly, supportive environment provided by Community Base allows a wide range of charities and community groups to work together, share their expertise and provide much needed services to the local community and beyond.
